Steppe Wildlife Conservation & Research Center is dedicated to protecting wildlife in Mongolia's steppe zone.

The steppe zone is treeless and prone to droughts, soil erosion, and desertification.

Steppe Wildlife plants trees to protect this area. The trees also provide shelter, food, and resting locations for wildlife.

EDUCATION



Steppe Wildlife works in the local community to increase awareness and change behavior by making conservation personal. They visit local schools and give live presentations. They also offer students the chance to go out into the field to search for and track Pallas Cats.
